DEPARTMENT FOR LEVELLING UP VISIT TO RMC

On 21st March we were delighted to welcome a group of delegates from DLUHC who had travelled from all over England to spend their Away Day at our offices in the Jewellery Quarter.

Steve Nesbit and his team were keen to learn about all of our work with a special interest in the Afghan and Ukrainian Resettlement programmes. After arriving and being introduced to the team, our Head of Service Abbas Baig gave an introduction into RMC's background and work followed by a presentation about our resettlement work by Sandra Tittel and Kamran Mushtaq.

During the morning sessions all 16 delegates were shown around both of our sites in small groups where they had a chance to talk to members of our frontline, resettlement, employment and health teams as well as some of the resettled families from around the region.

Our visitors were very grateful for the opportunity to talk to families around housing issues in particular and have found the information exchange very helpful for the development of future resettlement policy.

VINOCHOCK ORCHRESTRA

A Ukrainian children's orchestra has been established to help retain cultural identity and support with trauma and wellbeing. Children of all levels and all ages (ideally 8-18 years) are welcome. Rehearsals take place at the Midlands Art Centre (MAC) in Canon Hill Park from 11:30am (arrival time) for two hours, 12-2pm every Sunday.

Some members of Birmingham Conservatoire are helping with wind instruments and the 20 year old Ukrainian conductor is currently studying composition there.

This is a very exciting opportunity as there are lots of instruments to choose from and some lessons will also be offered with no costs involved.

Ukraine Permission Extension scheme (UPE)

In February 2024, the government announced that people who have permission to stay under one of the Ukraine Schemes will be able to apply for an additional 18 months of permission to stay in the UK within three months before the expiry of their current permission to stay.

This further permission to stay will provide the same entitlements to access work, benefits, healthcare and education. The application will be free.

Further details of the scheme have not yet been published.

Ukraine Family Scheme

This Scheme closed for new applications at 3pm on 19th of February 2024. Any applications that were submitted before that date will still be considered under the previous rules.

Homes for Ukraine

This scheme is still open but permission to stay is now granted for 18 months (rather than 3 years).

For applications submitted after 3pm on the 19th of February, eligible applicants may be sponsored by people who are British or Irish Citizens or settled in the UK.

Ukraine Extension Scheme

This Scheme is closing for new applications on 16th May 2024. Applications remain open for children born in the UK to parents that have permission under on the Ukraine Schemes.

What will happen if I don't receive a decision on a UPE application before my current permission to stay expires?

The law protects people that submitted a valid application in time and before the current leave expires (known as 3C leave).

Your leave is extended for as long as the Home office takes to make a decision. This means you will continue to have the right to work and claim benefits while you wait for a decision

You would normally not able to travel whilst your application is pending.

How will be notified that we are eligible to apply for the UPE?

The Home Office has not published details about the scheme yet but it is expected that this will happen towards the end of 2024 as the first visas granted under the Ukraine Schemes will be expiring in March 2025.

We advise you to seek legal advice within the three months before the expiry of your permission to stay in the UK.

What kind of evidence will need to be submitted for the UPE application? Do I need to show that I have made the UK my main place of residency?

The Home Office has not published details about the scheme yet but it is expected that this will happen towards the end of 2024.

Normally people applying for further leave to remain are asked to prove their residence in the UK for the duration of their current permission to stay. While we do not yet know what documents will be required for this application, it is generally advised that you keep records or your residency in the UK such as payslips, school/college letters, NHS letters, utility bills, bank statements etc.

My Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) is expiring on 31/12/2024 but my permission to stay is valid for longer. How will I be able to prove that we have permission to stay and travel outside the UK?

The Home Office plans to phase out all BRPs by the end of 2024 and move to a digital system of eVisas.

An eVisa is an online record of your immigration status and the conditions of your permission to enter or stay in the UK. You will need to create a UKVI account, if you don't already have one, to be able to access your eVisa.

If you have a BRP that expires on 31 December 2024, the Home Office will contact you to explain how to create a UKVI account and access your eVisa before the expiry date of your BRP.

During 2024, you should continue to carry your in-date BRP when travelling internationally until it expires.

From Summer 2024 onwards, if the passport or national identity document you are travelling with is linked to your UKVI account, airlines and other carriers will be able to digitally check that you have permission to come to the UK.

City CouncilFINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR ACCOMMODATION4UNDER THE LOCAL AUTHORITY HOUSING FUND

As part of the homelessness strategy, Birmingham City Council (BCC) has made available a limited number of properties under the Local Authority Housing Fund (LAHF). Although these properties are classed as Temporary Accommodation (TA) they are dispersed accommodation and are a better alternative to the traditional TA offer.

The properties are partially furnished prior to occupancy, however, to support guests moving into these properties, BCC will make available a grant of up to £2,000 for additional essential items.

It is important to note that access to this grant is not an automatic entitlement. It is a discretionary grant which means that applications may be refused if they do not meet the specific conditions.

Key points to note:

Grant Amount: The maximum amount available is up to £2000 and is subject to approval.

Eligibility: The grant is available to households on the Homes for Ukraine programme in Birmingham who are facing homelessness and who have a homelessness application registered with Birmingham City Council.

It is not available to:

a)households on the Family Visa or Ukraine Extension Scheme.

b)Homes For Ukraine households who have not been hosted in Birmingham

Application Limit:

On receipt of the tenancy for an LAHF property the household can submit one application within the first month of moving in.

Evidence Requirements:

Please ensure that you provide valid documentation/receipts to support your application. Payments in advance will not be made.

Eligible items

Items eligible are restricted to: a)Flooring (if there is no covering on the concrete), b)Washing machine, c)Dining table, d)Wardrobe.

The financial support for LAHF properties is not part of the regular HFU Move On fund, which is why the list of eligible items is restricted. This means when your family is ready to move from the LAHF property into permanent accommodation an application to the Move On fund can be made. However, any monies already paid towards the LAHF property will be deducted before considering your application to the Move On fund. It is also important to note that any items purchased for the LAHF property should be retained by your family when moving to new accommodation as a new application for the same items will be rejected.

Please speak to your advisor at Spring Housing if you have any questions about the Local Authority Housing Fund and how to register your homeless application.



IMPORTANT UPDATE ON MOVE ON GRANT CONDITIONS

We would like to inform you of some important updates regarding the Move On fund, designed to help Ukrainian households to move into independent accommodation. It is important to note that access the move to the fund is not an automatic entitlement. The fund is a discretionary grant which means that applications may be refused if they do not meet the outlined conditions.

More details about the move on is available at: <u>Homes for Ukraine – move on funding</u> | <u>Birmingham City Council</u>.

Here are the key updates:

1. Grant Amount: The maximum amount available is dependent on the number of guests in your household up to £2000/£4000. Please note this funding is not an automatic entitlement and is subject to approval.

2. Eligibility: The grant is available to households hosted under the Homes for Ukraine scheme in Birmingham.

It is not available to:

(a) households on the Family Visa or Ukraine Extension Scheme.

(b) Homes For Ukraine households who have not been hosted in Birmingham.

Applications from guests who have been rematched into Birmingham from another Local Authority maybe considered on an individual basis depending on BCC receiving funding following the transfer.

3. Application Limit: Each household can submit a maximum of two applications within the first three months of securing a tenancy within the private rented sector. Please remember that the application is linked to the property and not to individuals within the group.


4. Evidence Requirements: Please ensure that you provide valid documentation/receipts to support your application. Payments in advance will not be made.

5. Eligible items: The list of eligible items has been updated. This list is not exhaustive; however, only essential or emergency items will be considered. The updated list can be found on the website at:





St George's Day - 23rd April 2024

St George's Day used to be a national holiday in England. It is now an observance that is celebrated with parades, dancing and other activities. Shakespeare Day – 23rd April 2024

Many fans and enthusiasts of William Shakespeare, who was one of England's greatest poets and dramatists, celebrate National Shakespeare Day, also known as Shakespeare Day, on April 23 each year.

Special pageants are held at Stratford-upon-Avon in Warwickshire, where Shakespeare was born and where thousands of tourists go each year to see his plays performed. The bells of Holy Trinity Church ring out and the Mayor of Stratford leads a procession there to lay flowers on Shakespeare's' grave. The procession includes bands, civic dignitaries, costumed actors and actresses, Morris dancers, and the staff and pupils of some local schools.

We offer appointments with our specialist team of mental health care professionals, called the Neighbourhood Mental Health Team via your GP practice.

This new service makes it quicker and easier for people to get the right support by bringing together a range of services available in the NHS and in your community.

How can the service help me?

We help people by providing support, advice, and treatment.

We can help you with your mental and physical health, as well as helping you resolve issues affecting your wellbeing such as money, work, housing, relationships, trauma, abuse, or addiction.

Who can access the service?

We welcome anyone aged 18 or over who is experiencing new or ongoing mental health symptoms, as well as people who have an existing mental health diagnosis such as Bipolar, Personality Disorder, Schizophrenia etc.

Who are the Neighbourhood Mental Health Team?

We are a group of mental health care professionals based at local GP practices across Birmingham and Solihull.

The service is provided in partnership with Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust and Birmingham Women's and Children's NHS Foundation Trust and is part of the Birmingham and Solihull Integrated Care System (ICS).

What will happen in my appointment?

Appointments take place at your GP practice or over the phone or video call with a mental health care professional. Occasionally our team may also visit you in your home depending on your circumstances.

In your first appointment we'll ask you to talk about how you're feeling, the symptoms you are experiencing and what is happening in your life.

We will listen to you and your experiences and will recommend options to help you to manage your situation and take the next steps to getting further treatment and support.

This may include things like:

- getting a therapy or counselling appointment
- being prescribed medication
- helping you connect with services available in your local community to get support with any issues affecting your wellbeing such as housing, money, or relationships.

The Community Mental Health and Wellbeing Service does not replace an appointment with your doctor, so you'll still be able to see your GP or Psychiatrist if you need to.



How do I make an appointment?

To book an appointment contact your GP surgery and ask about the Community Mental Health and Wellbeing Service.
